Highlights of the Jasper County Charter System Board of Education Meeting held on Tuesday February, 15, 2022 6PM, at the Central Services Office

- Mr. Schilling called the meeting to order and welcomed all present.
- The agenda was approved as presented
- Opening ceremonies were held.
- Ms. Lynch led the Board and audience in the reading of the mission and vision statement.
- There were no public comments
- Tasia Ellis provided the Board with a CTAE update. The month of February is CTAE month in Georgia and Jasper County is holding several events to promote the program. A new scholarship is being sponsored for participants in the program. A logo contest is underway in the system for CTAE. Career day will be held on February 25th. You Science family event will be held on February 28th. Finally, Hog Heaven on Highway 11 will be held at JCHS on Saturday February 18th.
- Mr. Garland provided a COVID-19 update. He noted a significant decrease in the number of reported cases with both students and staff. The Board asked about protocols for athletic events. Mr. Garland stated he would follow up with their request. He noted if we are visiting a school that the home school's protocols must be followed as several systems are applying required masking and temperature checks at the events.
- LS3P Architectural Services provided a detailed presentation on the roofing projects slated for Central Services and JCHS. They also provided some information regarding the JCPS renovation project. The Board authorized Mr. Garland to proceed with securing a civil engineer to certify drainage plans for the Central Services roofing project.
- The Board approved the purchase of doors from Georgia Hardware Distributors for \$22,340 for various entries at JCMS.
- The January 2022 Financial and Expenditures report was presented. Revenues exceeded expenditures by 13.26%

- The Board approved the Superintendent recommendation to increase substitute teacher pay from \$72 per day to \$88 per day for non-certified and \$85 per day to \$105 per day for certified effective February 16, 2022.
- The Board authorized the surplus sale of welders from JCHS agriculture department.
- The Board approved the Superintendent to authorize the donation of a 2002 model bus to the Jasper County Sheriff's Department for training purposes.
- The Board authorized surplus sale of three additional buses retired from the fleet.
- Per the request of the Superintendent, the Board tabled action on the School Resource Officer contract.
- The Board approved the minutes from the January 11, 2022 work session and January 25, 2022 business meeting.

- Ms. Carmen Garland provided the Board with a presentation regarding Engage Georgia. The Georgia Department of Education has partnered with Graduation Alliance to provide an extra layer of support for K-12 students and their families to boost school engagement and academic success. Students who choose to participate in the program will be assigned an Academic Success Coach who will answer questions, connect them with resources, and develop a plan to help the student stay on track and engaged with their schooling.
- Mr. Garland presented a one-page summary of Winter Map testing results. Red numbers in parenthesis indicate progress at mid-year.

LITERACY

District GOAL- By the end of the 2021-2022 school year **JCCS** will increase the percentage average of students scoring average, high average, and high in Reading on the MAP Assessment will increase from 62% to 66% on the Spring MAP 2022. (60.8%)

By the end of the 2021-2022 school year **JCPS** will increase the percentage average of students scoring average, high average, and high in Reading on the MAP Assessment will increase from 66% to 68% on the Spring MAP 2022 Assessment. (68.9%)

By the end of the 2021-2022 school year **WPES** will increase the percentage average of students scoring average, high average, and high in Reading on the MAP Assessment will increase from 60% to 65% on the Spring MAP 2022 Assessment. (60.8%)

By the end of the 2021-2022 school year **JCMS** will increase the percentage average of students scoring average, high average, and high in Reading on the MAP Assessment will increase from 56% to 65% on the Spring MAP 2022 Assessment. (54.1%)

By the end of the 2021-2022 school year **JCHS** will increase the percentage average of students scoring average, high average, and high in Reading on the MAP Assessment will increase to 67%. (58.1%)

MATHEMATICS

District GOAL- By the end of the 2021-2022 school year **JCCS** will increase the percentage average of students scoring high average, and high in Math on the MAP Assessment will increase from 27% to 34% on the Spring MAP 2022. (34.84%)

By the end of the 2021-2022 school year **JCPS** will increase the percentage average of students scoring, high average, and high in Math on the MAP Assessment will increase from 40% to 43% on the Spring MAP 2022 Assessment. (50.4%)

By the end of the 2021-2022 school year **WPES** will increase the percentage average of students scoring high average, and high in Math on the MAP Assessment will increase from 24% to 33% on the Spring MAP 2022 Assessment. (30.5%)

By the end of the 2021-2022 school year **JCMS** will increase the percentage average of students scoring high average, and high in Math on the MAP Assessment will increase from 20% to 30% on the Spring MAP 2022 Assessment. (25.5%)

By the end of the 2021-2022 school year **JCHS** will increase the percentage average of students scoring high average, and high in Math on the MAP Assessment will increase to 37% on the Spring MAP 2022 Assessment. (32.9%)
